In the years prior to the Civil War, Natchez was a thriving community of northern planters who employed European craftsmen to build their homes. French, English, Spanish and West Indian design elements were combined to create a distinctive collection of mouldings, doorways and medallions. During the Civil War, Natchez became the Union Army's command center, protecting the homes from destruction. Today, Natchez represents the largest collection of pre-Civil War homes in the United States.
